172 applicants = 94 Recipients

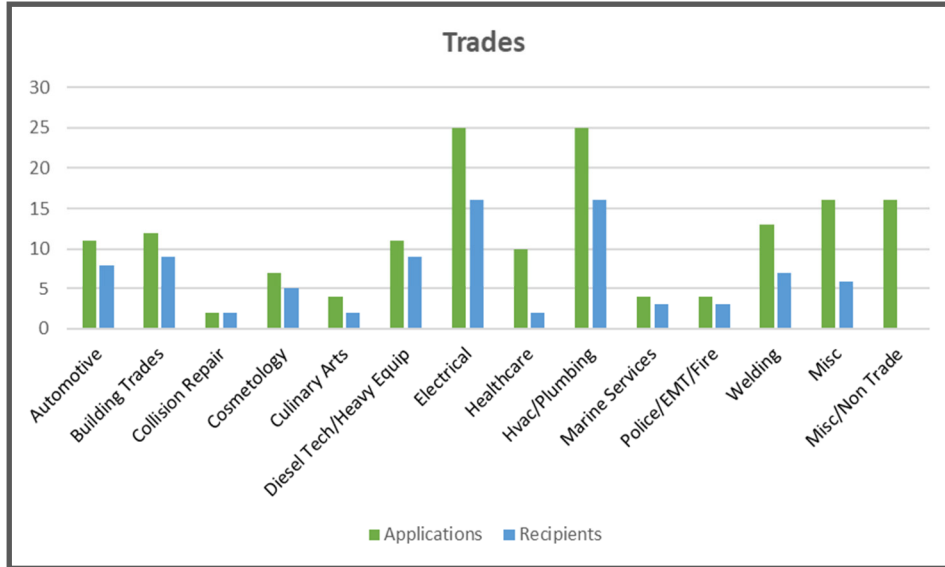


2022 Operating Expenses

MBC works to go beyond just providing scholarships. Businesses that donate \$2500 are provided the applications in their respective field and over \$5000 they can also have a named scholarship. This offers the opportunities for businesses to connect with our future trades people for internships and job placement.

Evan first became interested in welding during a visit to PATHS in 8th grade. He continued in high school working with fire and metal in the welding program at PATHS, he knew this was where his future career was headed. The scholarship is a real benefit for Evan, as most trades people are aware and as Evan shared, "Prices for tools are insane. This scholarship allowed me to purchase right away some of my tools, steel toed boots and specialized clothing necessary for welding. I was lucky the application also connected me with a business, Moody's HD, and I now have a part-time job while attending EMCC."

Through the application process **Moody's HD** (Heavy Duty Truck) learned of Evan attending EMCC in Bangor and reached out to offer him a part time job while pursuing his education. This is a win-win for the recipients and the businesses. Evan will earn valuable experience working in the field and HD has a motivated, willing to learn coworker. "He has been a real asset to the team", **Shawn Moody** stated, "Evan arrives with a great attitude, willingness to learn and contribute to Moody's latest venture of repairing Heavy Trucks / Equipment. We are proud our partnership with MBC allows us to support and connect with our future trades people as they build their rewarding and lucrative career in the trades."
